## So in September, please have the following done:

- <u>Purchase an AMSCO Reader</u>. This will be our primary textbook for the year so make sure you purchase it ASAP!
- <u>Download The American Pageant text and save this to your Google Drive</u> (This will be our ancillary textbook)

## The Assignment:

- 1. Read the ENTIRE PREFACE AND INTRODUCTION to the AMSCO Text. This is a great deal of technical knowledge about the AP US History course and will introduce you to the skills and themes necessary for success in this class. Please contact me with questions (see paragraph below).
- 2. Read ALL of Period 1, Chapter 1 pages 1 22 in your AMSCO Reader. After reading the excerpt on Page 13, answer the following prompt in a 1 page response: "Should Americans celebrate Columbus Day? If yes, why? If no, why not? Are there other Italian figures whom we should celebrate?" In your response you should consult AMSCO pages xxv xxxi:
  - a. Have a thesis (make an argument)
  - b. Support your argument with clear evidence (hard facts)
- 3. Read Elliott West "American Indians" and Complete a Secondary Source Review
- 4. Go somewhere historical, tell me about your visit!
- 5. Accept the Course Invitation (Pending, be on the lookout for this)
